

Aufgabenbeispiele/ Schwerpunkte zur Vorbereitung auf die Eignungsprüfung im Fach Englisch

1 types of sentences

affirmative sentences: He sings a song.

negatives sentences: He does not sing a song.

questions: What song does he sing? Does he sing a song? Who sings a song?

2 the formation of plurals

plurals with –s and irregular forms (book - books, mouse - mice)

3 determiners

some / any; (too) much / many; a lot of; enough; little / few with countable and uncountable nouns: little time, much work, enough money, many books, few people.

I cannot find any mistakes. He made some mistakes. Have I made any mistakes?

He made too many mistakes. She made a lot of mistakes.

4 adjectives, comparative and superlative forms, comparisons

low – lower – lowest, big – bigger – biggest, easy – easier – easiest, simple – simpler – simplest

beautiful – more beautiful – most beautiful, active – more active – most active

good – better – best, bad – worse – worst, little – less – least (money), little – smaller – smallest (in size)

He runs as fast as a rabbit. My flat is bigger than yours. I haven't got as many books as you. Chinese is more difficult than English.

5 adverbs and adverbial phrases, their position in sentences

I clean my flat **once a week**. She **always** reads the paper **after breakfast**. We **often** go to the theatre. I have seen this film **three times**.

6 the finite verbs forms

present tense: I often **call** my mother. He never **calls** me. (simple) - I am just **calling** her (progressive) **I'm visiting** my sister this evening. (future meaning)

past tense: **I called** her yesterday. **I was calling** her when you came in.

present perfect: He **has** just **called** me. They **have been talking** for hours.

past perfect: He told me that his mother **had called**. They **had been talking** for hours.

will-future: I hope he **will call** me. She **will be waiting** for my call.

going-to-future: I'm not going to help her. It's going to rain today.

irregular verbs: go – went – gone, do – did – done, read – read – read, make – made – made, buy – bought – bought, etc.

7 vocabulary / topics

introducing yourself, family, job, hobbies, holidays, future plans,

your daily routine, housework, shopping, going to restaurants, theatres, cinemas, sports, etc.
